THE WEARING OF EARRINGS FOR P.E.

For safety reasons children cannot wear earrings during P.E. lessons. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings please ensure that they are taken out before they come to school.

If your child is within the 6-weeks period after having their ears pierced when the earrings cannot be removed **you must supply plasters** that can be placed over your child's earrings to allow them to take part in P.E. lessons, which are a compulsory part of the National Curriculum. **The school will not provide plasters**.

If your child has not had their ears pierced and you are considering doing so, please wait until the start of the summer holidays as this will minimise the time that plasters will need to be worn for P.E. lessons

AFTER-SCHOOL COLLECTION OF CHILDREN:

If your child is in Y5 or Y6, attends an after-school club and you have indicated that they will be collected by an adult on the consent form, you must let the school office know if you have told your child to walk home unaccompanied. We cannot accept the word of your child.

Please remember that it is our school policy that children in year groups up to and including Y4 must be collected by a responsible person who is at least 16 years of age. This includes at the end of the school day and collection from after-school clubs etc.

If you send an older sibling who is under 16 into school to collect your child, whilst you wait in the car, they will be sent back to get you.

This policy is not to deliberately inconvenience parents, but is to help to keep your child safe and we appreciate the on-going co-operation and understanding of the vast majority of parents in this matter.
